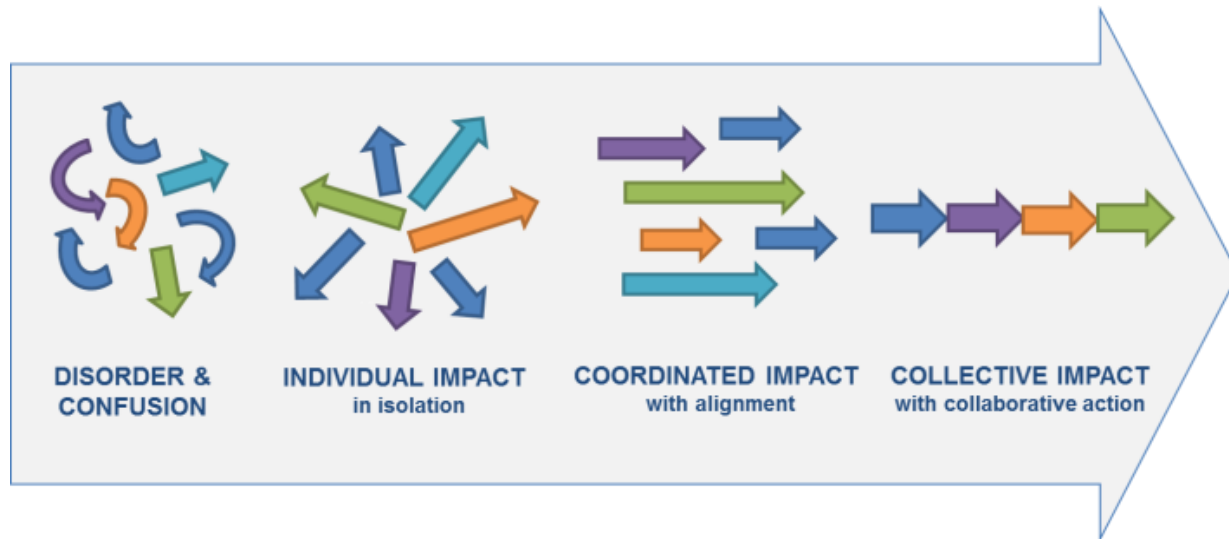

MISSION

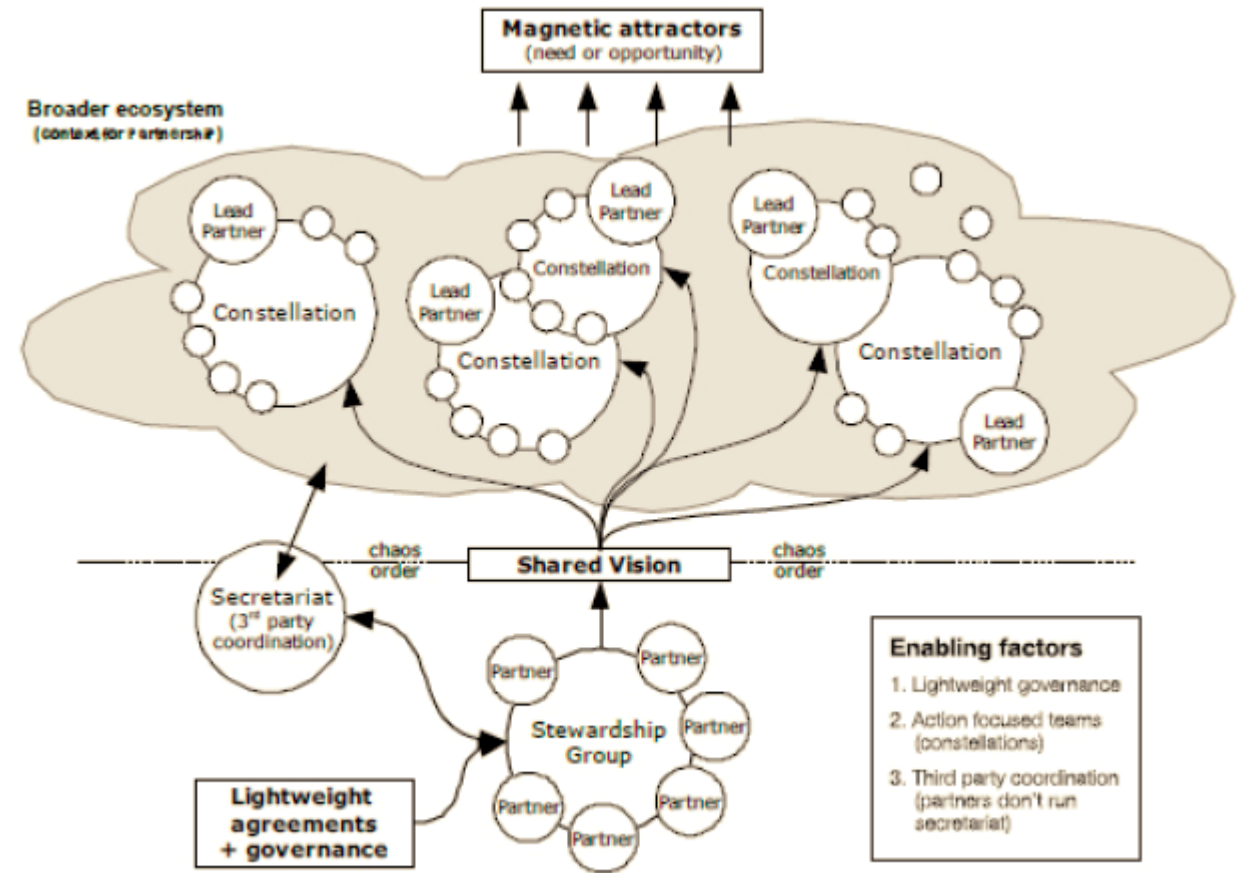
We, the members of the Santa Fe Community Educators Network, (SFCEN) are committed to:

LEVELS OF COLLABORATION

1. COMPETE

Organizations compete with each other for audiences, resources, visibility.

2. CO-EXIST

Organizations exist in the same community but do not engage with each other.

3. COMMUNICATE

Organizations are aware of each other's programs and convey information to each other.

4. COOPERATE

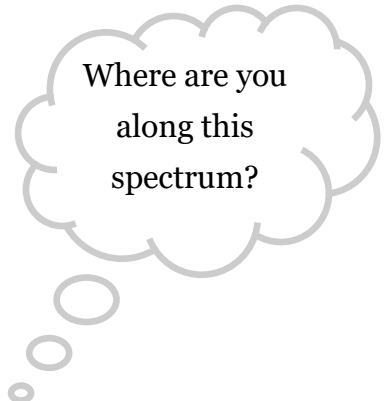
When intersections arise, organizations work with each other on alignment for greater outcomes.

5. COLLABORATE

Organizations work together regularly to align programming with each other without altering the mission of the individual organizations.

6. INTEGRATE

Organizations collectively address needs in the community and collectively fundraise for the purpose of collective impact.



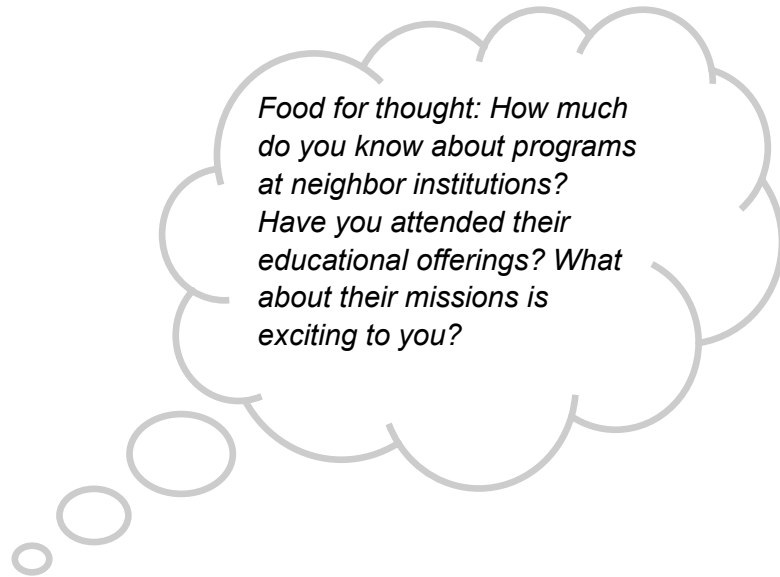
Where are you along this spectrum?
