In 2022, NMOST continued our collaborative partnership with the New Mexico Public Education Department which includes NMOST providing technical assistance for ESSER III-funded OST programs. In addition, NMOST hosted its third virtual Fall into Place conference for hundreds of OST providers, directors, and staff; awarded thousands of dollars in scholarship funds for the fifth year in a row to young NM women pursuing STEM degrees and careers; and continued its work as a major convener for OST staff, policymakers, and state leaders. We also welcomed new staff while wishing a long-time staff member well on his next adventure. 

NMOST utilizes data and mapping to strategically plan, advocate, and create transformational change for youth from all backgrounds in the state.



By providing free virtual workshops and networking opportunities throughout the calendar year, NMOST connects and supports hundreds of OST professionals.



The Network walks the walk by investing in the future. In 2022, NMOST was able to provide \$8,000 in scholarships to young women pursuing STEM degrees/careers.



NMOST works to equip OST programs with tools and resources to meet our goal of expanding opportunities for New Mexico youth to learn about and experience entrepreneurship and innovation.



New Mexico students cannot learn and succeed if they are running on empty stomachs. NMOST works to expand access to healthy meals during OST periods — because hunger doesn't stop after the bell.

Since contracting with NM PED to provide technical assistance and support for continuous quality improvement of **ESSER III** funded programs, the NMOST team has connected with over 50 OST sites, including both LEAs and CBOs, through bi-monthly calls, virtual TA sessions, and site visits.






Financial Support for Young New Mexico Women Pursuing STEM Degrees and Careers




Provided to 45 young women to date over the past 5 years, helping NMOST close the STEM gender gap and inspire the next generation of female innovators and leaders.





Expanding Youth Entrepreneurial Horizons



In 2022, NMOST received funding from the Mott Foundation to launch a new youth entrepreneurship initiative. Through this new initiative, the Network will work to increase diversity in youth entrepreneurship programs and expand access to entrepreneurial opportunities for underserved youth.

Addressing the Childhood Hunger Gap

Through its hunger prevention initiatives and partnerships with statewide organizations, NMOST has expanded food access through OST programs by increasing the number of participating CACFP sites. the Network NEW CACFP successfully worked with NMPED to implement a meal requirement for the 52 new ESSER III-funded afterschool sites.
