Course Number	Course Title	Summary
1	School Age Care as a Family Service: Emphasis on Relationship Building	Course goals include exploring the current status of U.S. children and youth related to after-school programs and services, identifying major issues which are impacting the development of after-school services for children and youth, exploring strategies for advocating for the positive development of the field of school-age care, and identifying the historical roots of after-school programs in three different fields and identify trends in after-school programming on the national level.
2	School Age Care as a Family Service: Emphasis on Planning Opportunities for Family Involvement	Course goals include: exploring ideas and tools for keeping parents and guardians informed about program activities, exploring a variety of strategies and tools for soliciting feedback from families, and exploring ideas for sustaining relationships with families and sharing important information about children with parents and guardians.
3	Sharing Information with Parents and Other Professionals	Course goals include exploring the use of individual participant portfolios as a basic tool for sharing important information and documentation about a participant with families and with other professionals, exploring strategies for involving families in portfolio development, and exploring strategies for

sharing portfolios with families and other professionals.
